- E. Bonfire Budget Proposal: Pro Temp Roberts, Senator Jordan, Senator Marrow and Executive Assistant Courtney have been working on.
 - a. Project Description: Interact with students, staff, and ASG alumni in a fun atmosphere while enjoying s'mores and hot beverages. As the first ever ASG alumni events many of ASG's past presidents, vice presidents, senators, and directors will be in attendance and this event provides the opportunity to display the changes to campus and build relationships between the alumni and students.

- F. ASG Updates
 - a. Executive
 - i. President Harmon:
 - 1. Will be at the Board of Governors these next three days. There will be interesting topics covered particularly with coaching staff. Football team ran into some issues and will have information on that. See what Bills are doing and maybe developing something with president of ACASU.
 - 2. Starfish: Sending out a large module. Expecting to start seeing starfish to continue. Ways that all students can get involved would be helpful and President Harmon will bring that up with the Leadership Team and Academic Counseling.
 - 3. Homecoming week: Lots of events are coming up.
 - a. Pro Temp Roberts: Just to clarify, Starfish is a program to have professors and student and faculty all communicate. Works as an emergency alert system, so if your grade is falling behind or

there are things endangering grade it's a way to communicate or a way to tell students they are doing a great job. It just gets confusing sometimes.

- i. President Harmon: Kudos was supposed to reach 90% of students. It's more for General Ed classes and maybe underclassmen
- b. Senator Bayer: CSM was making it mandatory for professors needed to do a biweekly update. To personalize this can be through professors.
- c. Parliamentarian Etleman: Has seen how they can be personalized by editing different things.
 - i. President Harmon: Professors maybe need to get used to it and that'll help with involvement.
- d. Vice President Trujillo: Do you want ASG to start advocating for it?
 - i. President Harmon: Yes, there are some kinks that need to be worked out. Helen Capriccio is making flyers.
- e. Senator Marrow: John Sandoval and Dr. Lopez worked on it and maybe more teachers need to pitch ideas. We could possibly refer students to us through there.

 - i. President Harmon: We need to figure out where our role is in this
- g. Senator Bayer: Our role is to spread message with students. maybe bring into Advisor Council meetings. We seem to be happy where we are and seems that people don't want to move forward with new technology. All the grades and kudos you can get in contact with Professors if this is utilize correctly.
- h. Parliamentarian Etleman: To help with that, maybe have teachers give an intro of Starfish to their classes. Maybe market for project. Hold special event for Starfish. Service will keep getting used and right now and if we don't work to help promote it'll continue to not get appreciated by students.
 1. President: The problem is they are finding loopholes every week. They are trying to work those kinks out. Once they start getting a better vibe of where we are at with Starfish, they maybe we could run with that idea to hold a special event for it.
- i. Senator Marrow: There is another contradicting factor, some professors don't put grades in BB but update in Starfish.

- i. President Harmon: The program is sending the report, the teachers aren't sending it. That was another issue is the program would send a report then put the teacher's name signed at the bottom and a lot of professors don't want something sent out with their name on it when they didn't even look at it. They fixed that but now if you do get a personalized message from you professor that means they sent it. Its going to come down to professor participation, yet not many professors are using it.
 - j. Senator Bloyd: Without target audience for Starfish, it should only be for the freshman and those in intermediate courses because that is kind of the focus of what Starfish is advocating for. Yet there are laws of getting ride of intermediate level out of universities.
 - k. Senator Bayer: Professor participation, propose to faculty senate. Good resources to advocate.
